Middlebeck Newark





Community volunteering goes wild in Newark with the conclusion of U&C's first volunteering month. Set to be an annual series to increase volunteering and to consider creative ways to give back to our communities.

16 volunteers from across the business and five employees from charity Sustrans combined forces last week to support the local community as part of a corporate volunteering day. Situated next to the Middlebeck development the National Cycle Network route 64 runs from Market Harborough to Lincoln and is buzzing with wildlife.

Unlike the two previous volunteering days where the weather had been warm, dry, and sunny, in Newark it was dismal – not that you would notice through all the team positivity and smiles. During the hours leading up to the event, organisers were frantically planning alternative options for 'wet weather', as the lightening struck the ground only miles away from our site. Without any large indoor space, and a group of volunteers excited to make a different, as they say in theatre 'the show must go on'. Once the electrical element of the storm moved away from the development and it was safe, we could continue activities as planned.

The well-used cycle way is naturally beautiful and often selected by Middlebeck residents for walks and cycle rides. Vegetation along the route grows very quickly and some cyclists and pedestrians leave litter behind them. That's where the volunteering team come in handy. Installing bird and bat boxes, clearing overgrowth, and litter picking were the core activities of the day, along with an educational talk from Sustrans national lead ecologist Jim Whiteford.

Attendees during the day included PMs, CCPs, DMs, Support staff, Designers, Finance Managers, and Senior Directors, all coming together to give their time to the local community.

Urban&Civic encourage employees to take part in up to three volunteering days per year to support local communities and to promote positive health and wellbeing.
